

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

BRUCK AN DER MUR – KAPFENBERG

Lively urban culture with nature close at hand. The historic old town of Bruck an der Mur will make an impression with its magnificent architecture and charming flair. Those who love knights or falconry, will find what they are looking for at Oberkapfenberg Castle in the neighboring city of Kapfenberg, home to sports and high-tech alike. Both cities combine nature, culture, and recreation. Just the place for a stroll through the city to visit a café or restaurant.

WALDHEIMAT-VEITSCH

In the region around Krieglach, you can't help but follow in the footsteps of Peter Rosegger: his birthplace, the woodland school at Alpl and the Rosegger Museum provide insight into the life of the Styrian poet.

The annual Christmas Joy Hike during Advent, based on one of Rosegger's most famous tales, is a truly memorable experience. In the Veitsch valley the world's largest walk-through wooden pilgrim's cross is a towering sight on the Ölberg Mountain at Veitsch.

The nearby Brunnalm-Hohe Veitsch alpine pasture

region attracts visitors in every season with nature,

sports, and fun for the whole family.

STYRIAN SEMMERING

Culture, nature, and sports. That's what the Styrian side of the Semmering has to offer. The UNESCO World Heritage Semmering Railway, the SÜDBAHN Railway Museum and the Winter Sports and Brahms Museum in Mürzzuschlag promise you many exciting discoveries. In the winter, the Stuhleck ski resort delights visitors with its perfectly groomed slopes. And it's not just skiers who get their money's worth. The summer months beckon both bikers and nature lovers on scores of hiking trails, especially the wind+bike Park at Pretul. You can round off the day with Styrian cuisine in cozy lodges and inns.

MÜRZ OBERLAND NATURE PARK

Hiking in the footsteps of climate change, an experience nature museum, the Forest of the Senses, and the alpine plateau at Schneealm: In the Mürz Oberland Nature Park it's all about experiencing nature. The region is also something to be explored on two wheels. Those just cycling for pleasure can take to the R5 Mürztal Valley Bike Path that follows the former railway line, while mountain bikers will find all of the idyllic alpine pastures and marked mountain tour paths their hearts' desires. Neuberg an der Mürz offers culture enthusiasts a wealth of architectural monuments, concerts, readings and the chance to see traditional glassblowing up close.

With its basilica, Mariazell is Austria's most famous place of pilgrimage. Pilgrims arrive from all directions: on any of the traditional trails leading to Mariazell or on the Mariazell Founder's Trail itself. Wander in, take a deep breath, and get on the move. The Mariazell Bürgeralpe is an alpine experience for the whole family, easily accessible by the Bürgeralpe Express cable car directly from the Mariazell town center. The Museum Tramway steam locomotive takes passengers to the crystal-clear Erlaufsee lake. Connoisseurs can look forward to true heaven-sent treats: Mariazell's own honey gingerbread and soothing liqueur digestif are a centuries-old tradition.

MARIAZELLERLAND

ALPINE REGION OF HOCHSCHWAB-POGUSCH

Summit bliss, the scent of herbs, and clear mountain air. In the Hochschwab region every hike becomes a rendezvous with nature. With a little luck you might spot some chamois and ibex sharing the trails with you. In the valley the many themed trails devoted to water and wild herbs invite you to explore the region that is known for its pure spring water. It comes from the Hochschwab mountain and flows to the metropolitan areas of Vienna and Graz. The Bürgeralm alpine pasture at Aflenz will delight you with its alpine flora, edelweiss, thyme and goldenrod and in the winter there's magnificent natural snow. Experience nature that's a class of its own. Those looking for cultural inspiration as well as what nature has to offer, will find their muse in the neighboring communities. From the historic Hammerherrenhaus manors of the mining families of old, to the highest elevation barefoot trail Bründlweg around the Pogusch mountain, there are always culinary rewards waiting for you too.

STYRIAN MARIAZELL TRAIL 06

FROM THE VILLAGE OF SOBOTH VIA GRAZ TO MARIAZELL

In 10 daily stages, the trail leads from Soboth via Graz to Mariazell. From Schanzsattel Pass, there are two routes - 06A by way of Veitsch and 06B through the Mürz Oberland Nature Park - to the destination.

VIA SACRA

FROM THE TOWN OF BRUNN AM GEBIRGE TO MARIAZELL

The Via Sacra, the Holy Road, is the oldest and probably most popular pilgrimage route in Austria. In 5 daily stages, it leads along a traditional route to Mariazell and offers numerous places to stop for refreshments and overnight stays along the way.

MARIAZELL FOUNDER'S TRAIL

DER PILGERWEG VON ST. LAMBRECHT NACH MARIAZELL

The pilgrimage route from the town of St. Lambrecht to Mariazell. The pilgrimage route follows in the footsteps of Monk Magnus (see info box on the right) in 7, 8, or 10 daily stages from the Benedictine Abbey of St. Lambrecht via Aflenz to the Basilica at Mariazell.

ROMEA STRATA

BALTIC SEA – ADRIATIC SEA – EUROPEAN LONG-DISTANCE TRAIL E6

The Romea Strata, part of the European long-distance hiking trail E6 from the Baltic Sea to the Adriatic Sea, connects historic pilgrimage routes to form a unique cultural route through Europe. From the Baltic States, it leads through Poland, the Czech Republic, and Austria all the way to Rome. In Austria, it runs along the Via Sacra, the Mariazell Founder's Trail, and the Marian Pilgrim's Trail in Carinthia, among others: each a route filled with history and spirituality.

THE FOUNDING OF MARIAZELL

It begins with a journey, a statue, and a mission. Legend has it that in 1157, Abbot Otker of the Benedictine monastery of St. Lambrecht sent the monk, Magnus, to the remote Mariazell region to take care of the spiritual needs of the people living there. He took with him a statue of the Virgin Mary carved from limewood, which he had been given permission by the abbot to take on his long journey.

On the evening of December 21, a boulder was blocking the path near his destination. Magnus turned to the Mother of God for help, whereupon the rock split and the way was cleared.

Upon reaching his destination, the monk placed the statue on a tree stump and began to build a "cell" to serve as a chapel and, at the same time, became a humble accommodation for himself.

This Mary in the Cell gave the place its name.

The statue of Mary in Mariazell, known as the "Magna Mater Austriae," is probably the lady in Mariazell with the most extensive wardrobe. Over time, more than 300 magnificent dresses have been collected. The statue can only be viewed in the simple form in which Magnus brought her there each year on September 8 and December 21.

TRUE MASTERS AT WORK

It doesn't matter from where you embark on your journey into the Hochsteiermark region, culinary delights of the highest standard are waiting for you. In addition to the numerous hospitality venues listed in the Falstaff Guide, the region also boasts seven restaurants that have been honored with prestigious awards such as Gault&Millau toques, green MICHELIN stars, or the Bib Gourmand. What makes these hospitality venues so special? The highest quality, creative cuisine, and cordial service – whether you're dressed for hiking or in your Sunday best. And dishes such as venison heart with sliced goose liver or Pretul char with monks cress are tasty treats that will most certainly delight you.

TAVERN CULTURE WITH HEART AND GOOD TASTE

Where better to experience food culture than where locals gather, innkeepers talk about customs, and dishes are served as they have been enjoyed for generations? In the region's hospitality venues, Styrian taverns and Kulinarium Steiermark restaurants among others, the menu features down-to-earth home cooking, often reinterpreted and always with a focus on regionality. Local brewers and beekeepers go well together: fine craft beers and sparkling mead frizzante. Digestifs and fine brandies round off the meal.

ALPINE CUISINE THAT INSPIRES

A different kind of stop for refreshments, and a treat even in summer. From May to October, alpine lodges and refuges, some of which are listed in Falstaff, invite you to take a break while they serve you authentic alpine cuisine. In addition to traditional dishes such as bacon lentils with bread dumplings, Hochsteirernudeln pasta, or Fedlkoch, vegan dishes such as sweet potato curry are also on the menu.

Those who want to experience more can get a firsthand look at regional cuisine at workshops on organic farms or in cooking classes with award-winning chefs.

HEINZ REITBAUER

Holder of three Michelin stars, awarded five Gault&Millau toques for years, and ranked among the 50 best restaurants in the world: As the patron of the legendary Steirereck in Vienna's Stadtpark and the Wirtshaus Steirereck am Pogusch in the Hochsteiermark region, like

no other Heinz Reitbauer is synonymous with the new Austrian cuisine – and for Styrian culinary culture on a global level.

You are considered to be one of Austria's best chefs. What does it take to reach the culinary Olympus?

Above all, there has to be an appreciation for food, an attention to consistency, passion, and a great team. The awards, of course, are important, but we regard them with respect and humility—always knowing that all of this is only possible because we work together. The greatest challenge is finding the motivation to dare to do something new, for tomorrow.

It is quite an honor for Styria for both restaurants to have "Steirer" in their names. How deep are your Styrian roots? Styria is the place I call home.

How would you define Styrian cuisine?

I'd say, Styrian cuisine is very product-focused. It has regional roots to be experienced authentically and it something we make the most of. Styrian cuisine is everything you encounter here time and time again. For me, it is really one of a kind.

In a podcast, you talk about the best potato you've ever eaten. What exactly did you mean?

I dug that potato out of the ground myself. It was about understanding where the product comes from, and that's exactly where we need to take people back to; to show them how food is produced. I only serve food that has been produced sustainably and is genuine for us.

At Pogusch, in addition to tree houses and sleeping in barns, there are also cabins in greenhouses where you can spend the night. Right at home with the plants?

That's right. With a garden and ten beds under glass. Our friendships with the best farmers and gardeners have often led us to special places. Those greenhouses, surrounded by plants and flowers, were special places to eat and celebrate with our friends. We would like to pass these special experiences on to our guests and encourage them to enjoy the sustainability and positive feelings, even letting them help with harvesting and cooking.


The Steirereck restaurant also has a Schankkuchl. What exactly is that?

The "Schank" is always a memorable place in a restaurant. Whether it's cooking over an open fire or with steam, the Schankkuchl offers a modern and light interpretation of just how our regional agriculture plays out in contemporary dishes. Sitting at the long table, engaged in conversation, watching the Schankkuchl team prepare your food. Just enjoying it all.

A WEALTH OF

THE HOCHSTEIERMARK REGION – A SOURCE OF CRYSTAL-CLEAR DRINKING WATER

One of the Hochsteiermark region's most valuable treasures, the purest drinking water, has its source in the Hochschwab region. Purified by natural filtering processes in the karst rock, it is affectionately known in selected restaurants as the Champagne of Alpine Pastures.

VIENNA RELIES ON THE HOCHSCHWAB

For over 100 years, the 1st & 2nd Vienna mountain spring pipelines have been supplying the metropolis with high-quality drinking water, without pumps, using free gravity flow via aqueducts to Vienna. The springs in the Mariazell region have long become the most important water suppliers to the federal capital.

GRAZ SETS ITS FOCUS ON THE FUTURE

The provincial capital of Graz also relies on high-quality drinking water from the Hochsteiermark region. The Hochschwab Süd water utility has been supplying drinking water from the southern part of the Hochschwab mountain range since 1993. A quarter of Graz's water need, around 5.3 million cubic meters per year, is met in this way. The water travels a distance of 78 km.

OUR WATER - OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Water is life, and in the Hochsteiermark region, it is a source of identity, quality, and pride. Conscious use of this treasure is part of our culture and our promise to everyone who lives in or visits the Hochsteiermark region.

Did you know

- ... Vienna can draw up to 437,000 m³ of the purest spring water per day via mountain spring water supply lines, which is more than it needs for everyday use?
- ... the water from the Hochschwab massif flows to Vienna via a free gradient of 280 meters without the need for pumps?
- ... getting the water from the mountain to Vienna takes only about 36 hours, but it takes up to four years for it to move inside the mountain?
- ... up to 2,000 mm of rain falls annually in the Hochsteiermark region, twice as much as in Vienna?
- ... less than 1% of the world's water is consumable drinking water and we in the Hochsteiermark region have the privilege of being able to enjoy it directly from the source?
- ... conscious water conservation, even with seemingly inexhaustible sources, helps to protect nature and resources for future generations?








The historic walls of the former monastery are home to arts and crafts, nativity scenes, and unique glass pieces from the Kaiserhof glassworks.


Christmas Joy Hike
